TOUR 1

Contemporary architecture in Tallinn

TOUR 2

Masterpieces of Soviet Architecture

Transport: bus + walking

Duration: 3 hours

This tour will take you to see some of the finest and most exciting examples of Soviet architecture across Tallinn, from buildings erected for Soviet power structures to large-scale prefab-suburb area. With this tour, you'll also get a chance to peek into some of the buildings!

There is also a possibility to visit the Museum of Estonian Architecture where Tallinn Architecture Biennale TAB 2017 Curator Exhibition is on display.

- Cinema "Kosmos" an example of Soviet architecture right in the heart of Tallinn
- Tallinn Song Festival Grounds the scene for the biggest music event in Estonia
- Pirita Spa Hotel at the Tallinn Olympic Sailing Centre and the Olympic facilities on the Pirita River an overview of how Tallinn was changed for the 1980 Games
- Soviet prefab-suburb Lasnamägi large-scale Soviet urban planning
- Linnahall Concert Hall Soviet landmark connecting the city and the sea









TOUR 3

Tallinn Old Town Transport: walking

Duration: 2 hours

This tour will unlock the fascinating history of Tallinn's magnificent Old Town. At each of the most important sights in the Old Town the tour guide will tell tales that uncover the past of Tallinn City. This tour goes way beyond dates and architectural styles and helps you make sense of our complex history, culture and life in Tallinn today.
